## **An introduction to our newest employee**

Liana Martinez graduated with her NP in 1998 from the University of Pittsburgh and is working on her doctoral, hoping to be done in 2 years. She currently drives to El Rito from Albuquerque three days a week, where she lives with her husband and 6 dogs.

When asked how she connected with LCDN, she said "I teach ACLS and one of your providers, Katie, was taking my class and thought I would be a good fit with LCDN. I love Northern NM – it is so beautiful."

Stating that she has four grown children and two grandchildren, Liana goes one to say, "My oldest daughter flies on Air Force One. My father is from Hawaii, my mother from England."

"My husband's family dates back to the Onate period here in NM. He played basketball for Taos Catholic High School and they took the state championship in 1967. The school closed that year, so he played his

## **May is Women's Health Month**

Along with Mother's Day on the 11th, May is also Women's Health Month. For your review here is a list of check-ups you as a women should do, especially in preparation for a visit to your own health care provider.

Before your next check-up make sure you do these four things.

### **1. Review your family health history**

Are there any new conditions or diseases that have occurred in your close relatives since your last visit? If so, let your health care provider know. Family history might influence your risk ⇨

of developing heart disease, stroke, diabetes, or cancer. Your provider will assess your risk of disease based on your family history and others factors and may also recommend things you can do to help prevent disease, such as exercising more, changing your diet or using screening tests to help detect disease early.

### 2. Find out if you are due for any general screenings or vaccinations.

Have you had the recommended screening tests based on your age, general health, family history and lifestyle? Check with your health care provider to see if its time for any vaccinations, follow-up exams or tests. For example, it might be time for you to get a Pap test, mammogram, prostate cancer screen, color cancer screening, sexually transmitted screening, blood pressure check, tetanus shot, eye check or other screenings.

### 3. Write down a list of issues and questions to take with you.

Review any existing health problems and note any changes.

- ⇒ Have you notices any body changes, including lumps or skin changes?
- ⇒ Are you having pain, dizziness, fatigue, problems with urine or stool, or menstrual cycle changes?
- ⇒ Have your eating habits changed?
- ⇒ Are you experiencing depression, anxiety, trauma, distress or sleeping problems?

If so, note when the change began, how it's different from before, and any other observation that you think might be helpful.

Be honest with your provider, If you haven't been taking your medication as directed, exercising as much or anything else, say so. You may be at risk for certain diseases and conditions because of how you live, work, and play. Your provider develops a plan based partly on what you say you do. Help ensure that you get the best guidance by providing the most up-to-date and accurate information about yourself.

### 4. Consider your future

Are there specific health issues that need addressing concerning your future? Are you thinking about having infertility treatment, losing weight, taking a hazardous job, or quitting smoking. Discuss any issues with your provider so that you can make better decisions regarding your health and safety.
